The following tables summarize information from a large case study review of QuarkNet teachers and the schools their represent. The parameters of this case study are approximately 250 teachers (registered to participate in QuarkNet during the 2022 program year) from the 24 centers who were included in the quantitative analyses that addressed teacher- and studentlevel outcomes. (Three of these centers: Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory, the University of Illinois at Chicago, and the University of Notre Dame centers were omitted as each center had registered teachers at very few schools. Given the small number of schools involved this could inadvertently lead to identifying the participating teachers.)

Approximately 120 schools are included in this summary. Please keep in mind that QuarkNet focuses on individual teachers and is not a professional program at the school-wide or science department level of a particular school.

In addition to the name and city, state location of the school, school-level student demographics included: enrollment size; gender breakdown of students (percents); ethnic breakdown of students (by percents); and the percent of students who are eligible for free or reduced lunch programs.

We base this summary on publicly available information - we have tried to remain consistent in what/where this information was selected because this information may vary considerably depending upon the website chosen. In most cases, selected information came from either www.publicschoolreview.com or www.privateschoolreview.com webpages. We have accepted this information at face value. Many schools reported by QuarkNet teachers have very similar names/locations compared to other schools not represented; we have done our best to select the school identified by that individual teacher.

We have organized this information by center in the hope that such organization would help facilitate its usefulness. The review of this information is likely most meaningful when discussed by a given center and with those most familiar with the local schools and the catchment area represented (e.g., QuarkNet lead teachers, mentors, others).
