
Backup Documentation, QuarkNet Teachers' Workshop (July 7-8, 2022)

QuarkNet is a nonprofit collaboration dedicated to developing America's technological workforce. It is an NSF-funded partnership between Fermilab at the University of Notre Dame, with the primary goal of providing science teachers the means to develop their skills and bring real research experience into the high school science classroom.

QuarkNet works in partnership with many centers throughout the United States. A new center was just established at UC Irvine in 2022. As our first event, we held on July 7-8, 2022 a workshop for local high school teachers. In this workshop teachers met faculty and research staff, heard presentations about the cutting-edge in our field, toured our laboratory facilities, and carried out a series of hands-on activities designed to expose them to particle physics research.
